




There are 5 key areas in which a child should develop skills to have a holistic upbringing that helps them realise their full potential.



Cognitive



Teacher's Note

Think! extends pupils' thinking through questions that **spark curiosity** and challenge misconceptions

Communicative

Teacher's Notes

- ► Learning objective: Identify common materials
- Explain to pupils that things made of plastic take a long time to break down and so, we should use less plastic
- ► Get pupils to think of ways to use less plastic in their daily lives

Teacher's Notes encourages **sharing & discussion** sessions where pupils verbalise their answers and practise communicating their ideas to an audience. This helps pupils to get a head start at developing their public speaking skills.



Social



Cooperative Learning: Pupils can use the chapter opener to learn with their peers through conversation with others. This can broaden their perspectives.

Self-care & Hygiene

KG: Fine Motor Skills
